



Cinnaminson Soccer Club Code of Conduct for Parents

Parental behavior will directly influence whether a child plays for fun and embraces sportsmanship and teamwork, or whether the child's experience is less than positive. Parental behavior is observed by more than their child: other players and other parents may be influenced for good or bad. Parents must follow these rules.

- Understand that your child should be playing soccer for their enjoyment, not yours.
- Learn and understand the laws of the game.
- Never criticize or argue with decisions of officials or coaches.
- Never reinforce the notion that officials or coaching decisions determine the outcome of a game. Teach your child accountability and responsibility, not excuse making.
- Applaud the good play of all players, including opponents.
- Never criticize, ridicule, or punish the mistakes of players.
- Never make derogatory remarks towards opposing players, coaches, or supporters.
- Control temper and resist both verbal and physical assaults.
- Never use inappropriate language.
- Accept success and failure, victory and defeat, equally.
- Teach your child that hard work and effort are equally important to victory.
- Recognize that coaches are volunteers and giving their free-time to work with your child.
- Be consistent, prompt, and respectful in your communication with coaches. Ensure that you understand the coach's expectations for you, your child, and the team.
- Ensure your child arrives at training, practices, and games on-time and fully equipped per the coaches expectations.
- Understand that failure to meet agreed upon expectations for practices and training can negatively influence playing time.
- Ensure that you are on-time to retrieve your child from practices and games.
- Recognize that the club is entirely supported by volunteers. Field maintenance, purchase of supplies & uniforms, practice and game scheduling, and the overall planning and execution of soccer in Cinnaminson is only accomplished by the hard work of the CSC Board, the coaches, and parent volunteers. YOU are a member of the CSC, so you must also step up and do your part. When asked to assist with club functions such as field setup, or tournament duty, you must understand this is not optional.
- Ensure your children who are also members of the CSC have read and understand the Player Code of Conduct.
- Understand that failure to follow this code can result in non-refunded removal from the club for more serious or repeated violations.
